His keen creative mind and artistic drive led him to a Tattoo apprenticeship. Vince's skills in the tattoo industry have been widely recognised, winning him numerous awards including the Realistic Animal Portrait category in the 2013 Ink-Off held by the Annual Logan Tattoo and Art Exhibition.

Working in the tattoo industry has given Vince the chance to hone his painting skills. Recently due to ill health Vincent found the need to reground himself. So to reconnect with one of his first passions, he decided to start making time again to go exploring within nature. Arming himself with an inexpensive DSLR he has spent much of his leisure time over the past 3 years exploring numerous locations throughout SEQ and has built quite a substantial collection of native wildlife and wildflower photographs.

Finding that his passion for conservation magnified throughout this time, Vince's goal now is to share some of these experiences by recreating his captured moments on canvas. He uses the profits generated from sales of his original artwork to aid Australian Conservation efforts and charities.

KFPS. has for some time been concerned about the habitat security at the "Duck Pond" for the Greeen-Thighed Frog. KFPS has commissioned a report from EcoSure with suggestions of possible actions to safeguard the habitat of this unique species.

#### **Concerns in Karawatha Forest**

There have been recent sightings of **goats** in the forest. BCC Local assets have removed most of them but a couple have avoided capture. If you see any goats please contact BCC 3403 8888.

While viewing video footage of the fauna using the Compton Rd overpass, it was noticed that there were **foxes** waiting at the bottom of the Ecoduct. Perhaps it was a good place to hunt as the animals crossed the overpass. Local Assets have begun work to catch and remove these animals.



While researching the route for the "Botany Birds and Butterflies" walk, it was noticed that people had spent time around the Duck Pond and left a serious amount of **rubbish**.

This detracts from the beautiful forest vista as well as destroying the scarce habitat of the native animals that are in that area.
