#### WALK TO DUCK PONDS 13 SEPTEMBER 2015

On September 13 we held a Walk to the Duck Ponds as part of Bush Care's Major Day out. This section of Karawatha was farmland that has been revegetated over the last 10 years. Apart from the twin macadamia trees, where the house stood, and a few rotting fence and electricity posts the Forest is gradually taking over. The duck ponds are actually dams that were used to irrigate strawberries. Pond one is ephemeral, in that it dries up, which makes it a perfect breeding pond for the rare Green-thighed frog, Litoria brevipalmata.

The Eastern Sedge Frogs, Litoria fallax, were easy to find in their host plant the Mat Rush, Lomandra longifolia and a lot of people where very surprised that such a loud noise comes out of such a tiny frog. It was fantastic to find some Koala scats at the base and scratches on the trunk of a Eucalyptus propinqua, the Small-fruited Grey Gum. We startled a few well camouflaged Evening Brown Butterflies, Melanitis leda, who love to munch on Kangaroo Grass, Themeda triandra.

The walk was well attended and we hope that we passed on some knowledge about the native plants in this area of the forest and the wildlife that use them. Many thanks to Rob Hinxman for sharing his depth of knowledge of our native flora and for his unique way of remembering the scientific names.

The foundation of the highly anticipated Discovery Centre is laid and the walls will start going up soon.

In other news from Council Officers, Weed treatments as part of the Wipe Out Weeds Program for 2015-16 will start in the coming weeks around the frog pond and surrounds (entire Woodridge boundary). These treatments will be targeting Kidney Leaf Mud Plantain, Columbian Wax Weed, Lantana, Mist Weed, Brazilian Nightshade, Cadaghis and Cocos Palms amongst others.

It is worth mentioning that the Woodridge Scouts (end of Elizabeth St) have removed all of the very large Slash Pines from within their land. This will help to reduce the number of pines coming up in the reserve which is great for the forest. Thank you Scouts.
